

## Social Programme (All rates are in Australian dollars)

## 0. Conference EVE: Saturday 30 November 2013 from 6pm to 10pm (Perth)

For those short course delegates and/or conference delegates who will be in Perth on Saturday 30 November 2013, The Chair/Vice-President IBS-AR (Mario) is organising a special pizza night in Perth (6pm-10pm). The evening will also involve other foods cooked in the pizza oven as well as a master class demonstration of pizza making!

The evening WILL BE DRY i.e. no alcoholic drinks allowed on the premises! This is so that delegates attending the pre-conference short courses the next day will be focussed, as well as course presenters and members of the committees need to also prepare for the next day's registration and meetings. There will be ample opportunities to sample the local wine and beer at the conference! Please note:

- i) Filtered water and soft drinks/juices will be available as well as hot beverages such as tea, hot chocolate, cafe latte or espressos on the night.
- ii) We will be organising transport to The Sebel Hotel Mandurah (TSMH)/other accommodation venues in Mandurah during the night (at least 2 trips, at 7pm and then 9:30pm). # 1. Welcome reception: Sunday 1 December 2013 from 6:30pm to 9:30pm (Mandurah)

A welcome reception / cocktail party will be held from 6:30pm onwards in the Acacia room at The Sebel Mandurah Hotel (TSMH) which is the venue for the conference. Registration will be open from 4pm-7pm. For the cocktail party, drinks will be available from 6:30pm. The cocktail food/canapés will be served at 7pm for 2 hours.

## 3. Social activities: Afternoon of Tuesday 3 December 2013

This is a long-standing part of the conference programme and so keeping with tradition we have arranged two options for the afternoon of Tuesday 3 December 2013 after lunch. We want you to relax, get a breath of fresh air, have fun and see some of what this part of Australia has to offer, especially for first-time visitors.

## 3a. Tour 1. Thrombolites and Winery tour

We first visit the thrombolites, which are odd, rock-like structures formed by photosynthetic microbes that precipitate calcium carbonate (limestone). This is located at Lake Clifton in the Yalgorup Lakes National Park, about 30 minute's drive south of Mandurah along Old Coast Road. Then we visit two wineries located in the Peel region, including a tour of each winery and the opportunity to sample and purchase local wines. Lake Clifton has unique reds, whites and fruit wines for tasting, grown in the limestone soil of the estate. Vineyard 28 (<a href="http://www.vineyard28.com.au/">http://www.vineyard28.com.au/</a>) also has red and white wine tastings and a winery tour. Lake Clifton Vineyard & Winery is located south of Mandurah along the Old Coast Road, and Vineyard 28 is on the edge of the Myalup State Forest. The tour includes a stop for afternoon tea at Decadent C's (<a href="http://decadentchocolate.com.au/">http://decadentchocolate.com.au/</a>).

## 3b. Tour 2. Mandurah canal & dolphin cruise

Mandurah Dolphin Tours offer a relaxing one and a half hour scenic canal cruise. The boat departs from Dolphin Quay taking in the Ocean Marina and Venetian Canals before cruising inland towards the Peel Estuary through the Creery Wetlands and Port Mandurah Canal. The trip passes the mansions of the wealthy in Mandurah and we also hope to see wild bottle-nose dolphins playing in their natural habitat. The unique Quay to Quay cruise will make a brief stop at the Waterside Restaurant in Mandurah Quay, before the return trip to Dolphin Quay.

The endangered Osprey Eagles have built nests on either side of the Mandurah Quay harbour with walking trails leading right to them. Kangaroos and dolphins also show up here, often quite unexpectedly. If you enjoy photography, bird watching, playful dolphins, nature, wildlife or excursions on the water, then you will love this cruise. The best way to see Mandurah is from the water and Mandurah Dolphin Tours certainly hold the key to a unique experience. Onboard afternoon tea included.

- 4c. **Kings Park** in Perth is the most visited tourist destination in WA. It covers 400.6 hectares, comprising bushland, tranquil parklands and the botanic gardens, and offers spectacular views overlooking the Swan River and the city of Perth. To reach Fraser Ave, take the train to Perth from Mandurah Station alighting at the Esplanade Station, and then catch buses 24 or 37 from St Georges Tce. Purchase a day-pass on the bus stopping outside the Tourist Bureau, in Mandurah (a short distance on the boardwalk from the Sebel Hotel). - 4d. **Fremantle** is a vibrant city located at the mouth of the Swan River and is recognised as one of the best preserved 19<sup>th</sup> Century seaports with over 150

buildings classified by the National Trust. - Catch the mini-bus (provided by the LOC) from The Sebel Mandurah Hotel to the MOFSC, and return. From 6:15pm.

- Catch the mini-bus from MOFSC to The Sebel Mandurah Hotel. From 10pm.
